

## GEORGIANS AT SAN JACINTO

This year is the 150th anniversary of Texas independence from Mexico, the result of Texas' <sup>miraculous</sup> ~~almost accidental~~ victory over the army of Gen. Santa Anna at San Jacinto, Texas on 21 April 1836. The following list of Georgians in that battle, with some biographical information, was sent to the State of Georgia by Harriet Smither in 1932. This list is not complete, omitting for example ~~John~~ <sup>also</sup> ~~Lind~~, Allen Ingram, Charles Hicks, M.K. Moses, Joseph Andrews, Samuel G. Hardaway, and James P. Tresvant, who had <sup>also</sup> been members of the Georgia Battalion but who escaped the massacre of that unit at Goliad, Texas on 27 March 1836.
